Charity

Whilst the focus has been on the tercentenary, our Fraternity, Lodges and individuals have continued to support charity throughout 2017 at both local and national levels.

At an individual level Bro Aaran Devenney's daughter Laura completed the Great Eastern Perkins Run (half marathon). Aaran's Lodge Thistle & Rose donated £200 to her chosen charity Muscular Dystrophy UK, the condition his dad, her grandad and his two sisters suffered with all their lives. As well as the money this helps raise the profile of this worthy charity.

Raising money for worthy causes to improve lives it's in our DNA



Nationally during the last 6 months alone, we have provided **£9.7 million** to support Masonic families experiencing a financial, health or family need.

£2.8 million was given to households in financial distress, who were unable to afford everyday living costs.

£1.5 million helped people access the medical treatment, mobility aids, home adaptations, respite care and counselling they need to live healthy and independent lives.

£1.6 million helped parents afford IT equipment, course materials, school uniforms and extracurricular activities for their children in full-time education.

£3.8 million was provided to fund a range of nursing, residential and dementia care to meet the needs of older people at **RMBI Homes**.



On 15th September at the Lodge of Heritage a number of eminent Corby Masons assisted by

the Deputy Provincial Grand Master VW Bro Trevor Boswell presented a series of cheques, on behalf of the Lodge to the following worthy causes: Lakelands, Corby Mind, Vine Community Trust - a total of £1200, and from the 15/16 cohort of masters £2,000 to Corby Home Start.
